

# Achille Albacini

Italian sculptor  
(1841-1914)

He was born in 1841 in the Italian sculptor family Albacini, also known as Albaccini, Albaghini or Albagini, who worked in Rome in the 18th and 19th century.

Achille Albacini's uncle was the sculptor Filippo Albacini, who was the son of Carlo Albacini who, besides being a sculptor, was also married to a daughter of painter Ludovico Stern. Achille thus had art in the blood from his birth and he also came to study at the Academy of Fine Arts Accademia di San Luca.

Most of his work performed Achille Albacini for private patrons for whom he made busts and statuettes on order. However, he also performed the statue of the dying San Giuseppe Labre under the altar devoted to this saint in the left transept of the Church of Madonna dei Monti (1892).

Achille Albacini died in 1914.
