## Igino Pineschi

Italian Architect (b. 1933)

He was born in Rome in 1933. Graduated in Architecture at the La Sapienza University of Rome in 1959, lecturer since 1971 in drawing and relief, and in Architectural and Urban Design until 2005, he was a consultant for environmental protection in the Umbria region; the most significant activity carried out in the Umbrian-Marche area was aimed at enhancing the historical and landscape-environmental pre-existing structures - such as, for example, in the Tronto Valley (Ascoli Piceno) and Colfiorito (Perugia) -, which involved the completion of the so-called *Great Apennine Excursion* and the reconstruction of the Umbrian stretch of the ancient Via Flaminia; moreover, he has undertaken the creation of a trekking itinerary in the provinces of Perugia and Terni, in particular the Monti Martani and Terre Arnolfe. Active in the archaeological field at the site of Carsulae (Terni), he has been involved in the protection of historical sites such as the Parco dei Monti Lucretili (Rieti). His writings include *La via Flaminia Antica in Umbria* (1997) and *Architectural planning in archeology* (2007).
